Lenten 2023 – Seeking: honest questions for deeper faith

The texts this year offers us many stories of Jesus encountering people who are seeking:

Nicodemus comes to him in the veil of night, Jesus approaches a Samaritan woman at a well, he heals a man born without sight. In these stories, each person is seeking a new beginning, a different life, a deeper faith. What unfolds is an exchange filled with questions and exploration. Often, an unveiling occurs—assumptions are disrupted, a new perspective is revealed, mystery grows.

This Lenten series is founded on questions. Some questions feel restorative (“Can these bones live?”). Some feel like a charge or challenge (“Who will you listen to?”). Some questions are hopeful and curious (“How do we begin again?”). These questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Hopefully they lead to a new beginning, a restoration, a wider grace.

Like the characters in the Lenten scriptures, we are also seeking many things: clarity, connection, wonder, justice, balance. We are seeking our calling, the sacred, and how to live as a disciple. In the turbulence of the past few years, many of us are asking big questions about our lives and our faith. If you are returning to church, you are probably returning with more questions and a critical lens. Perhaps this series will help us unpack some of those big questions in ways that are honest and faithful.

Throughout this season, we hope you will continually ask yourself: what am I seeking? What is God seeking? This Lent, we invite you to engage in the spiritual practice of seeking. We encourage you to stay curious, open, and nimble. We hope you will soften your assumptions and expand your perspectives.

Let us pray that these questions will create a safe space to explore—to be drawn more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God.

One Great Hour of Sharing and Fish Banks

Children and youth are invited to take home a fish bank to collect money during the season of Lent. These banks are meant to collect spare change which will go to One Great Hour of Sharing, which supports three programs in the Presbyterian Church: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and

Self-Development of People.

All three of these programs work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. Your help, no matter how big or small it is, is invaluable to supporting these missions and helping those in need around the globe! Make sure to pick up your fish bank next Sunday and start dropping those loose coins in! The fish banks along with a One Great Hour of Sharing special offering will be collected during worship on Palm Sunday, April 1st.

Lenten Bible Study “Witness at the Cross” by Amy Jill Levine

Every Wednesday beginning March 1st – April 5th 12Noon to 1pm

Experience Holy Friday from the perspective of those who watched Jesus die: Mary his mother; the Beloved Disciple from the Gospel of John; Mary Magdalene and the other women from Galilee; the two men, usually identified as thieves, crucified with Jesus; the centurion and the soldiers; Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. Jews and Romans, friends, and strangers, the powerful and the powerless, the hopeful and the despairing.

In Witness at the Cross, Amy-Jill Levine shows how the people at the cross each have distinct roles to play. Each Evangelist presents a distinct picture of the death of Jesus. Each portrays different individuals and groups of people at the cross, each offers different images and dialogues, and so from each, we learn how those meanings and messages cross the centuries to any who would come to the cross today.

Each Gospel has its own story to tell, all the witnesses have their own memories, and every reader comes away with a new insight. The witnesses at the Crucifixion watch Jesus die, and we watch with them, and we watch them. And we come away transformed.
